It's almost SAFI PIG ROAST time, and here's what you need to know:


**The day:** JUNE 9 at Nelson's and Collins'.

#### Safi School Project - Women's Health Project

Frida Alex, a graduate midwife and staff member of Karibu, consultants for the Safi School Project, has requested financial help from the Safi School Project Board for feminine hygiene support for the sponsored female students at Bishop Durning Secondary School. There are 27 Safi sponsored girls currently enrolled at Bishop Durning as boarding students. These girls are now utilizing pads or rags to take care of their menses, but none of them have money to buy pads on a regular basis, and using rags requires taking time away from study and school to keep a ready supply available. Several of the girls have menorrhagia and require more pads than normal, amplifying the situation.

It has been documented by multiple international organizations and women's groups that the education of girls in developing countries suffers when their monthly periods are not hygienically addressed, as the girls often do not attend school during this time. Bishop Durning does have an incinerator for disposal of the pads.

In correspondence with Frida I have been impressed with her grasp and understanding of the situation and her solution to assist the girls. In factoring costs of sanitary pads in Tanzania vs the US the cost is about \$1 more/month for normal menstrual periods. The sponsorship amount for the 27 girls would be \$130/month for the rest of this school year through December, 2018 (7 months). The pads would be distributed through Frida.

The Safi School Project Board voted to adopt the Women's Health Project as a sponsorship outreach to be offered specifically to women's groups such as Book Clubs, Knitting groups, Soup & Gather groups; and to individuals, for group sponsorship of one month at \$130.
